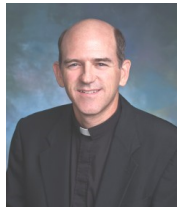

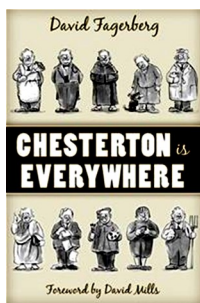

HURRICANE MYTHS

Myth: If I'm inland, I'm safe from a storm.

Reality: Even if a storm is at its strongest when it makes landfall, storms can linger inland for days, dropping tons of rain which can cause flooding. Plus, even though wind speeds will be lower, they can still be dangerous. In 2011, Irene hit the east coast from New England to Mid-Atlantic, but it caused huge amounts of inland flooding damage in Vermont and upstate New York. Almost every river and stream flooded in Vermont, damaging or destroying roads and bridges, costing the state \$700 million.

Myth: Preparing for the storm is too expensive.

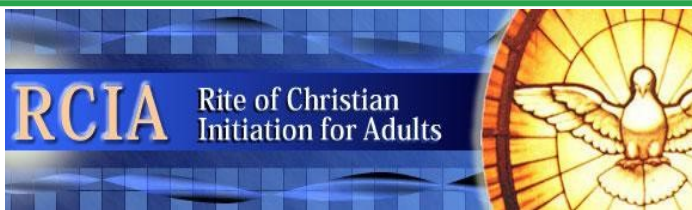
Reality: Many people believe they can't afford to spend money to strengthen their home before a storm, or even spend money on a hurricane supply kit. But there are lots of little things you can do, even now, to strengthen your home before a storm. If you do things a little at a time, all year round, you can be prepared when a storm comes. And with a hurricane supply kit, you may find you already have many of the items in your home. *Federal Alliance for Safe Homes* has tips to help you figure out how to affordably prepare.

ENTHrone JESUS AS KING OF YOUR HOME

Legion of Mary

The Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in the family is recognition of Jesus as King of the family.



By acknowledging Him as our King, we become His loyal subjects through love. We are reminded by the picture of His heart, given at the Enthronement, that He rules over our home and over the world through his great love for us.

This beautiful ceremony takes place at the home of the family, and all members of the family participate. The ceremony consists of special prayers, presentation of a plaque of the Sacred Heart, the Blessed Mother, and a certificate of Enthronement, ending with the blessing of the home by one of our clergy.

The Legion of Mary will help in the preparation of this ceremony, and representatives of the Legion of Mary will attend the ceremony. There is no preparation required by the family.

ST. JOHN VIANNEY FEAST DAY (AUGUST 4) 1786–1859

St. John Vianney, Priest (Patron of priests) Feast day—August 4. Universally known as the “Curé d’Ars,” St. John Marie Vianney was ordained a priest in 1815. Three years later he was made parish priest of Ars, a remote French hamlet, where his reputation as a confessor and director of souls made him known throughout the Christian world. His life was one of extreme mortification.



Accustomed to the most severe austerities, beleaguered by swarms of penitents, and besieged by the devil, this great mystic manifested a imperturbable patience. He was a wonderworker loved by the crowds, but he retained a childlike simplicity, and he remains to this day the living image of the priest after the heart of Christ.

He heard confessions of people from all over the world for 16 hours each day. His life was filled with works of charity and love. It is recorded that even the staunchest of sinners were converted at his mere word. He died August 4, 1859, and was canonized May 31, 1925.

2. Once you have completed the form, you may give it to an usher at Mass or turn it in at the parish or school office.

Please note that if you are already a registered parishioner within the Diocese of St. Petersburg, you are only allowed to be registered at one parish in the diocese.

If you wish to change parishes, complete the above steps and notify your current parish of your change.
