She has worked in the Diaconate Office, then became Executive Secretary to the Vicar General. In 2000, she was named Vice Chancellor, and since 2005 has been serving our diocese as Chancellor. Joan and her husband Richard, are active parishioners here at St. John's. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Joan and wish her all the best in her retirement!



### Fortnight for Freedom: June 21–July 4.

In April 2012, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops announced the first Fortnight for Freedom — a call to 14 days of prayer, education and action for religious freedom in the United States and abroad. The theme for 2017 is *Freedom for Mission*. The Fortnight will again take place from June 21–July 4. This two-week period is a time when our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power, including St. Thomas More, St. John Fisher, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome.

We are called during this time to reflect on the importance of religious freedom so that the church might have the space to carry out her mission of service and mercy. It is also a time to pray for our brothers and sisters who face intense persecution in other parts of the world. Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore will open the Fortnight with a special Mass on Wednesday, June 21<sup>st</sup> at 7 p.m. at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Assumption of the BVM in Baltimore, MD. This special Mass will be aired on EWTN.



Here at St. John's, we will commemorate this special Fortnight by praying a Litany for Liberty at our daily Masses during June 21–July 4. We will also include special prayer intentions for religious freedom as part of our general intercessions at our weekend Masses. Our daily Mass on July 4<sup>th</sup> will also acknowledge the closing of the Fortnight for Freedom.

### Feast of Corpus Christi — Sunday June 18<sup>th</sup> — Eucharistic Procession

It is traditional on the Feast of Corpus Christi to show our love for the Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, by having a Eucharistic Procession. We will have our annual Eucharistic Procession around the grounds of our parish and school property immediately after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, June 18<sup>th</sup>. After the Procession, we will return to the church for Solemn Benediction. Please plan to be a part of this special liturgy.



## ANNUAL PASTORAL APPEAL

If you recall, last weekend we shared the breakdown of where our APA dollars are spent. This weekend we will provide descriptions for the first two areas.



Social Services and Life Ministries—\$1,566,113 (10.6% of all donations): Services and outreach to the poor, marginalized and vulnerable focused on protecting public safety, promoting the common good and restoring community with justice and charity. One of the largest reaching ministries supported through APA is Catholic Charities.

They provide shelter and housing, medical services to the uninsured, pregnancy and adoption services, help to immigrants and refugees and so much more.

Vocations and Seminarian Education, and Religious, Clergy and Seminarian Support—\$3,049,112 (20.6% of all donations): This area of support may seem quite simple; the money goes to the seminarians. However, there is more to this. Some of the funds are used to help support and house retired priests and religious. Also, continuing education for our priests and deacons is vital to their service of our parishioners. Annual retreats are also a part of the services provided to our priests and deacons.

Next week you will hear more about the other two areas.



These warnings are issued by the National Weather Service and an alert is normally given 24 hours prior to landfall.


